I've loved drawing for as long as I can remember, and fortunately, my parents nurtured this passion from a young age by sending me to painting and drawing classes. I am a designer and tattoo artist by profession. I graduated with a degree in Plastic Arts with a focus on graphics from the Universidad Veracruzana in 2009.

For a long time, I focused on graphic design and illustration, participating in poster and children's illustration competitions. In 2010, I worked on the learning objects project at the Universidad Veracruzana, creating characters and animations. Since then, and from my early years in college, I developed a strong passion for editorial projects aimed at children's reading. As a result, I worked on various projects with companies such as Porrúa, Granjas Carrol, Editores Arroniz, and other clients. I've always been passionate about graphic storytelling. I was fortunate to join the team at El Mundo de Córdoba newspaper in 2013, working on a children's section called "El Mundo de los Niños," where I was able to do design, illustration, and content writing. That same year, I had my first solo exhibition of visual arts in my hometown of Xalapa, titled "Pages of a Grimoire." The exhibition explored the magical imagination of various Mexican traditions and featured multimedia projections as well as a performance in which I, dressed as a "witch," invited visitors to come for a consultation. Alongside this, I have conducted seminars on illustration at various institutions throughout the country.





For the past 2 years, I have also been dedicated to teaching techniques focused on tattooing, and I have conducted several in-person seminars:

- Introduction to Tattooing for Beginners
- Color in Tattoos
- How to Make Freehand Tattoos
- Floral Tattoos

Currently, I have sponsorship from a Mexican brand of products for tattooed skin care, called Neek'dna, and I am in the process of becoming part of the Emalla cartridge pro team.
